Object Lesson

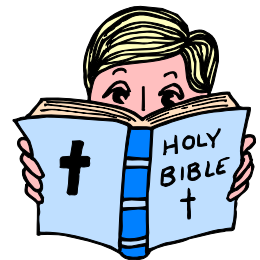

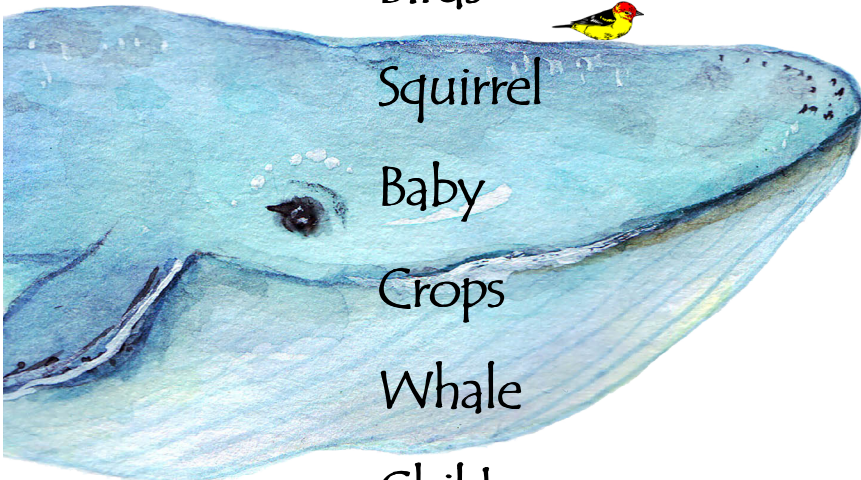
